Author Presentation:



My author presentation is a quick moving presentation with lots of pictures, videos, interaction and graphics. I focus heavily on the process of writing (and re-writing) as we discuss where imagination can take you. Some touchstones along the way:

My connection to books and writing as a kid.
What mistakes I made in my own writing from grammar errors to major social faux pas.
What lies I told and how I eventually found a way to use that creative energy for good
What inspired my first book
How I sold my first book
How I revised my first book
How I revised my first book even more
How it came into the world
And where it went from there with a peek at the Portuguese book trailer

Writing Workshops:



I love hosting dynamic writing workshops that include writing, drawing, storyboarding, memory prompts, mind mapping, group work and more. I rarely have kids JUST write. Instead, we work on how to get a story out of your brain, which requires many different methods. All my writing workshops usually have a takeaway. Some popular workshops include:

•Speculative Fiction: What is spec fic, anyway? In this workshop we use memory prompts to bring us to a big inciting incident that sends us into a whole different reality.

•Villainous Masterminds: Get ready to feel evil! In this workshop we dive into the shoes of some evil villains, build their character

backstories and create puppets to bring home.



• Heroes vs. Villains: Good or evil, you decide! In this workshop, we do immersion prompts to get into the skin of our characters, then develop them through multiple exercises and finally make our own hero trading cards.

Library, bookstore and book club programs:



I have worked in libraries as a programming librarian for many years. I love to create book-related programs from escape rooms to DIY craft projects.
